We have a large flock of black-footed penguins here at Banham Zoo. Suprisingly these penguins are not from the polar regions - but from Africa!


We have had many penguin chicks born here at the zoo.


Discovery Centre

The Discovery Centre is home to many different species of small animals. How many of each can you see?














Spider Monkeys



Spider monkeys are found in the jungles of South America. They have very long arms and legs and a very long tail. These help them to swing through the trees.


Our spider monkeys breed very well here at the zoo.




Otters




These otters are from South-east Asia. In the wild they would eat crabs, snails, fish and eggs.










Tigers




We have 3 tigers in the zoo - Miskha, Kash and Kumi. Kash and Kumi were born here in 2023.

Amur tigers are the largest of all the big cats! Their iconic pattern helps them to blend in amongst the trees.



They like to feed on lots of different types of leaves.




Each giraffe has a unique pattern. Draw some of the giraffes' patterns below.



Australian Paddock




These are called red kangaroos - even thought the females are grey in colour!
